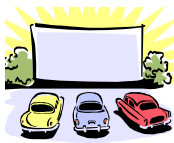

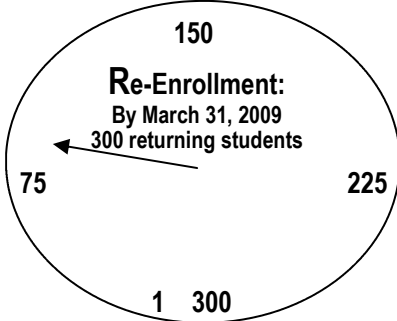


Decades Night - Tonight! Thursday, March 19 - 7:00pm in Leonard Hall

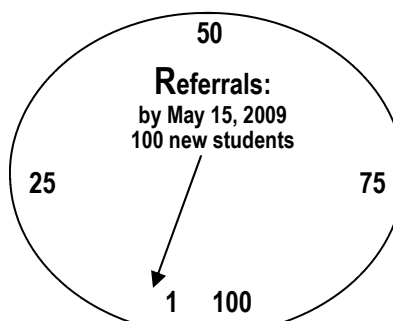

ECA: 425 Dashboard

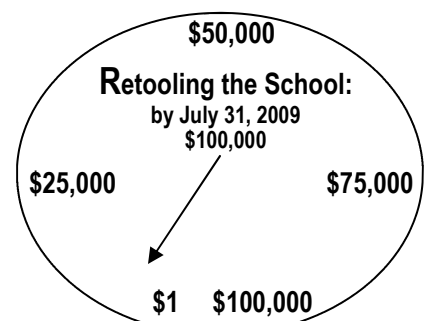


ECA is offering last year's tuition rates through March 31 to families currently enrolled in ECA; after that date, tuition increases 5% to the 2009-10 rates.

Tuition Assistance: Remember, we are praying that all students that God wants at ECA will be enabled to attend next year, regardless of financial means. Inquiries for tuition assistance are welcome through our Business Office.



ECA is offering a very special referral incentive from now through May 15. Each family who refers another family to register one or more full-time students will receive \$1,000 tuition credit for 2009-10, and each referred family will receive \$1,000 tuition credit (the credit will be less (prorated) for families with no full-time students). Families may have multiple-family credits to the point of providing full tuition! Join us in introducing new families to ECA.

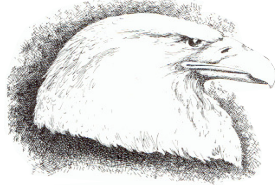
