2009 Eagle Classic a Success - Thanks be to God!

On September 14, 2009, 44 golfers enjoyed a great morning of golf and fellowship at the Colorado Springs Country Club at the 3rd annual Eagle Classic. The perfect weather enjoyed by the golfers was just one of the ways God blessed the efforts of the Eagle Classic Committee. Given the current economic environment in Colorado Springs, the committee knew they would be facing an uphill battle to find golfers and donors; and from the very first committee meeting, the entire effort was bathed in prayer. As donations came in and players signed up, it was amazing to see God at work. "It seems like every day leading up to the tournament, God surprised me with a new blessing," said Randy Geving, this year's tournament chairman. Many companies and individuals stepped up and generously contributed to the work at ECA, and one of the greatest gifts was provided by the Country Club. By contract, ECA had to pay for a minimum of 60 golfers; but as an unsolicited gesture of generosity, the Club released us from our contractual obligation and only charged the school for the actual number of golfers who played.

This year also marked the first award of the ECA Classic Church Challenge Cup. This prestigious award was won by Village Seven Presbyterian Church, represented by Mark Bates, Ron May, Alan Bruns, and Gordon Golden. The travelling trophy will be on the line at next year's ECA Classic which is scheduled for September 13, 2010.
