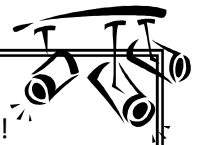

The **Varsity Lady Eagles** finished another record-setting year, defeating the #2-ranked Kiowa Indians to win the District VIII Championship for the first time in school history. At the Regional Tournament, the Lady Eagles defeated Sargent 43-25 in the 1st Round and ended with a tough 28-30 loss to Holyoke in the finals. The Lady Eagles finished the year 20-4, tying the school record for most wins in a season. Leading in Scoring was **Merrily Brast**, Assists and Steals **Heidi Mann**, Blocks and Rebounds **Ashley Branch**, and Offensive Rebounding **Julia Morin**.
