The Lady Eagles are playing strong, well-balanced soccer with 5 of the 10 top-ranked Region 2 3A leaders: **Heidi Mann** 9 goals/5 assists; **Chelsea Kohl** 4 goals/2 assists; **Sarah Kohl** 4 goals/10 assists; **Lorraine Lefever** 2 goals/2 assists; and **Ellen Brandenstein** 2 goals/4 assists.

**CSAL Junior High**, playing with whole hearts and no subs, ended regular-season League play with a solid 4-0 victory over Pikes Peak Christian on April 16. **Leah Bost** and **Michelle Williams** put in 2 goals each, and **Susie Edington** was strong in goal with amazing saves for the shut-out. **Nisse Erickson** and **Susie** are both playing well in their first season of soccer. The Lady Eagles played the CSS Kodiaks on April 22 (2-3) and look forward to the CSAL post-season tournament **today, April 22, through Saturday at El Pomar Sports Center.**

**CSAL 5th/6th Grade** completed regular-season play with their only loss, 2-3 to Divine Redeemer. The Lady Eagles enter the CSAL Tournament seeded #1 and play Pauline Memorial **today, April 22, at 5:30pm at Pauline Memorial.**

### Baseball

With a lot of hard work the Eagles, after starting 1 and 2, racked up 9 straight wins, defeating 2A Lutheran- Parker and Crowley County, BFL Cripple Creek-Victor and Miami-Yoder, and 3A Tri-Peaks TCA, Ellicott, and Peyton. Leaders during this stretch were **J.D. Kohl** in limited action (.800 batting average), **Markus Reuter** (.615), **Michael Reuter** (.583), **Matt May** (.552), and **Jeremy Andrews** (.522). **Josh Andrews** drove in 15 runs, and (14 RBI), **Markus Reuter** (14 RBI), and **Jon Diao** (12 RBI) also were key contributors. The streak ended when the Eagles could not overcome 6 errors and 9 unearned runs vs. Fowler, 5-11, and fell to Peyton 0-3. Overall, the Eagles are 10-4 and 4-0 in League. The **JV** team lost 2 darkness shortened games to Peyton (4-5 in 2 innings) and TCA (3-8 in 3 innings) but pulled out a mercy-rule shortened game vs. Ellicott (11-0) and are now 2-4-1. **Stephen Griffiths** and **J.D. Kohl** both lead JV with .500 batting averages.
