## **Spiritual Formation – Build Upon the “Fruit of the Spirit” at Home!**

At ECA we partner with parents and their church, that students might pursue their purpose in Christ! This year, we have a unique opportunity to leverage this partnership for the spiritual formation of each student in our school. Our Secondary campus has themed their chapel services around the “Fruit of the Spirit” to achieve this very thing.

In our all-school chapel recently, I had the opportunity to address all of our students about these fruits. Here is a reminder of how that fruit is described in Scripture. Please take a moment to find your Bible and look at the broader context of this passage:

***“But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, gentleness, faithfulness, self-control...” Galatians 5:22-23 (context Galatians 5:16-25)***

My main point to our students was this: If the Spirit of Christ is alive in you, you will bear the fruit of the Spirit in your lives because of what Christ is doing in and through you.

To drive this point home (probably better with the older students), I asked a handful of high school students if the fruit of the Spirit is more like a “thermometer” (to measure the reaction of something) or a “cookbook” (to learn how to do something). The first answered, “some of both,” while the others all answered “more like a thermometer.” While I said I’d give partial credit for the first answer, I preferred the “thermometer” answer better. In my understanding of Scripture, if the Spirit is alive in people, their actions will express His presence and rule in their lives, thus yielding the fruit of the Spirit.

Please take a look at these two passages which accentuate this point:

***“I can do all things through Him (Christ) who strengthens me.” Philippians 4:13***

***“If the Spirit of Him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, He who raised Christ Jesus from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies.” Romans 8:11 (context Romans 8:8-11)***

C. S. Lewis once said, “Christianity is not about making bad people good, it’s about making dead people alive.” In our school, we have many rules designed to maintain an orderly environment. Thankfully, we are not encouraging students to obey them to gain the Lord’s favor, nor secure salvation! However, with your help, we can engage each student in “spiritual formation,” praying for Christ to indwell each student’s heart, guiding him or her in His ways!

One good way to encourage this at home is to consider the fruit of the Spirit in the life of your children. Examine Scripture regarding how Jesus exhibited the fruit of the Spirit in many ways. Call upon the Spirit of Christ yourself, that His spirit might be seen as alive in you. Have a conversation with your child about how Christ can strengthen him or her to produce this fruit.

May ECA be a place that is always filled with the fruit of the Spirit, because of Christ’s work! Is this not the most important work we have to do as a school?

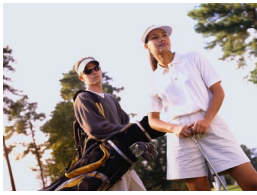
