Many recent top stories in the news involve tragic events that are creating fear in the minds of students in America. Most stories end up focusing upon school security, gun control, or other obvious reactionary methodologies. To be sure, these things deserve serious consideration; and, at ECA we have been having introspective dialogue amongst board members, administrators, teachers and parents. I feel confident that the progress we have made in these areas over the last decade will be reexamined for sufficiency and potential improvement as we move cautiously into the future.

However, there are mental and spiritual aspects of this subject that also need consideration and attention. No venue in America, nor in the world for that matter, is exempt from the impacts of a certain few people with undiagnosed or untreated mental health issues. While much could and should be considered about this topic, it is not the focus of this article.

I would like to mention something we can all understand that can help a majority of students cope with these situations and with the challenges of our time: I'm talking about the benefits of comforting one another in the Spirit of Christ in times like these. If we understand that the God of the universe is not ignoring this topic, it should give us comfort to know that He turns these circumstances into opportunities to draw people nearer to Himself. In fact, I'd consider that comfort and guidance are attributes of God that have been given to Christ and the Holy Spirit as they have also been deemed "paracletes." The word "paraclete" comes from the Greek (transliterated as "paracletos") which can mean advocate, comforter, guide, or helper. There are two Scriptural passages where this occurs:

I John 2:1 – in reference to Jesus Christ: *My little children, I am writing you that you may not sin. And if anyone sins, we have an advocate (paracletos) with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous; and He Himself is the propitiation for our sins.*

John 14:16 – in reference to the Holy Spirit: *And I will ask the Father, and He will give you another helper (paracletos), that He may be with you forever.*

Let us remember that God has given us Christ and His Spirit to be our advocate, comforter, guide and helper. Our souls, and those of our students, can be quieted knowing that God can turn these challenging times toward good for His eternal kingdom. Trusting in His provision for us can give greater comfort than any fence, lock, or camera!

I want to also challenge all parents and teachers to understand this extraordinary comfort that the Paraclete gives to all of us! In turn, let us rise to that challenge, and as He enables us, be paracletes to each other and our children/students.

Please join me in praying for the protection of all bodies and souls in the ECA family.
