The Mystery of Christ at Evangelical Christian Academy

The mission of ECA is to “partner with parents and their church to educate, equip, and empower students to pursue their purpose in Christ.” Within this mission, church parents endeavor to work in concert with our school in prayerful hope that their children will come to know Christ and will live out their lives guided and driven in all things by Christ’s Spirit. While we are all reliant upon the timing of the Holy Spirit for Christ’s indwelling in each person’s life, we pray that the methodology of an ECA education will be in concert with the work of Christ.

Early in ECA’s history, the school was named after the original founding church, Evangelical Presbyterian Church (EPC). Our school has always had a relationship with our host church, or churches. In fact, even when EPC changed its name to Grace Presbyterian Church and aligned with Village Seven Presbyterian Church for Sessional oversight, Evangelical Christian Academy retained “Evangelical” in its name.

How we understand and implement the use of “evangelical” in our name is key to that which we are as a school. Most people understand evangelical to mean “the good news.” I would say that our appropriate role in using “evangelical” is to emphasize what the good news does for us, rather than how we deliver the good news. Specifically, we are not necessarily the school God wants us to be just because we speak forth His name. Rather, our school becomes an instrument of God when students come to accept the good news of Christ. This is a work of the Lord, not the school.

To understand this concept, let me encourage you to read about Onesimus in the book of Philemon and Colossians 4. If you look carefully at this narrative, you’ll see four primary actors: Paul, the writer of both books; Philemon, the slave owner; Onesimus (the slave whose name means useless – but a man who becomes useful); and Christ (who at the time of this writing has risen, ascended to heaven, and is spoken of by Paul as the Lord to whom he is enslaved). Take a few minutes to read these two passages.

You’ll see that, in the book of Philemon, Onesimus appears to be a worthless slave who becomes useful in the Kingdom of Christ. This is validated in Colossians 4:8-9, where Onesimus is called by Paul to be “our faithful and beloved brother.” This is, of course, referring to the fact that Onesimus has become a Christian. While we might be sidetracked into thinking that the conversion of Onesimus was the work of Paul, in fact he was converted by Christ. This is the mystery of Christ that is mentioned in Colossians 4:2-4.

I consider our relationship to the gospel as one very similar to the account of Onesimus. We very much want ECA to be a place where the gospel is proclaimed, in truth, as it relates to every subject taught by our teachers. However, rather than thinking that our teaching will convert any student, we ought to continue to rely upon the “mystery of Christ” to take hold of the hearts of students in the perfect timing of the Holy Spirit. In fact, we are blessed to see the fruit of the spirit that is a genuine outworking of the Spirit of Christ in a majority of students while they are still a part of our school. However, we should always glory in this as a work of Christ solely! Please join me in praying for the hearts of every student to be drawn by the Lord, to the Lord!

We pray that each student is drawn near to the Lord each and every day. Have a blessed summer!
