

Evangelical Christian Academy: 2021-22 Supplies List - Secondary Campus

1) For ALL Secondary students, beginning the first day of school:

Duct Tape and sufficient brown, paper grocery bags to cover all textbooks, *including paperbacks*:

- * Brown, paper grocery bags only - sticky, adhesive-type and stretchy-cloth covers are not permitted.
- * Covers *must not be taped onto the inside of the book cover.*

Kleenex/Hand Sanitizer: Students will maintain their own personal supply and label the packages with their full names. Students may bring their own disinfectant wipes (optional).

Composition Books: Meade-type, *separate, designated, and labeled for each class*, wide-ruled preferred.

- Exceptions:**
- 1) Pre-Algebra, Algebra I, Geometry: *quad-ruled or graphing-type, any color;*
 - 2) Chemistry, General Math, Advanced General Math 6/7, Logic 8, Latin, Modern History/Literature 9: *none required.*

Pens: Three each red, blue, and black

Pencils: One set of colored; multiple No. 2's

Ruler: Twelve-inch

Index Cards: Three packs, lined, 3x5"

Assignment Book or Day Planner: Small, dated

USB Drives: if using ECA computers for research

2) For all HIGH SCHOOL students (in addition to above "for ALL Secondary students" items):

Bible: ESV, NIV, NKJV, or NASB

An organizational file or 3-ring binder with a section labeled and designated for each class

Folders: Two-pocket with brads for those designated on the reverse side of this sheet

Paper: Loose-leaf, college-ruled *for each class*

3) For all MIDDLE SCHOOL students (in addition to above "for ALL Secondary students" items):

Bible with Concordance: ESV, NIV, NKJV, or NASB

Folder: Thirteen-pocket accordion file folder (required)

Binders: Two three-ring, 1" (Latin, Grammar/Writing); one three-ring, 1-1/2" (Language Arts 6 & 7, Logic 8)

Tab Dividers: Two packs (Latin, Grammar); one additional pack (Language Arts 6 & 7)

Notebook Paper: Two packs, college-ruled

Graph paper: One pack, three-hole punched

Post-it notes: 1x1-2" or smaller, in three different colors

Glue sticks: Two

Highlighters: Set of six, chisel-tip

Scissors

White board markers and eraser

4) Calculator requirements:

General Math, Advanced General Math 6/7, Pre-Algebra, Algebra I & II, Geometry, AP Calculus, Business Math: TI-30XIIS (prox. \$10). **Note:** Although the TI-84 would work for the lower mathematics classes, its sophistication very often detracts from the learning process; the TI-30XIIS allows students to concentrate on the mathematical concepts themselves.

Honors Pre-Calculus: any version of a TI-84. Note: The advanced capabilities are needed, and the TI-84 also meets all of the testing requirements and parameters.

Chemistry, Honors Physics: TI-30XIIS - or - TI-84.

6) Specific class supplies in addition to the above requirements (continued on reverse side):

Algebra II, Honors Pre-Calculus, AP Calculus AB	<u>Spiral-bound</u> notebook specifically dedicated to math notes.
American Literature	Post-it Tabs: 1", writable, removable; "Grapes of Wrath," <i>purchase from Mrs. Butler</i> (\$5).
AP Language/Composition	Post-it Tabs: 1", writable, removable; contributions to the English Tea and Senior Lunch; "Tuesdays with Morrie," <i>purchase from Mrs. Butler</i> (\$8).
Art 6	Sketchbook, spiral-bound, 9"x12"

Band: MS & HS	Wind instruments in working condition with accessories (mouthpiece, reeds, oils); stringed instruments in working condition with accessories (shoulder rests, rosin, picks, shoulder straps); percussionists: 5A and 5B drumsticks; copy of "The Foundations for Superior Performance: Warm-ups & Technique for Band" by Richard Williams and Jeff King.
Biology	Four white board markers, in different colors.
British Literature	Post-it Tabs: 1', writable, removable; contributions to the English Tea and Senior Lunch; "Lord of the Flies," <i>purchase from Mrs. Butler</i> (\$6).
Choir: MS & HS	Three-ring binder, 1", <u>black</u> , and loose-leaf paper. Note: For performances - details of dress requirements are included in Course Outline. High School: <i>Possible</i> participation in USC-Pueblo Honor Choir.
Civics	Note: A 1 st Semester field trip to downtown Colorado Springs for polling (<i>possible</i> van fee); A 2 nd Semester field trip for a historical tour of Colorado Springs (<i>possible</i> van fee).
Composition 9	Two-pocket, plastic folder with brads to be used only for Composition 9 (1 per semester); two composition notebooks (Meade-type), college-ruled; highlighters, in three colors; scissors; bottle of Elmer's Glue.
Earth Science 8	Note: <i>Possible</i> field trip to the Denver Museum of Science & Nature (prox. \$13).
Geometry	Graph paper, 3-hole punched; compass.
HS Art I	Final Project: <i>possible</i> purchases for prototype (not known until the project is started).
HS Art II	Second Semester, Cartooning: 9x11" or larger drawing book, medium to heavy paper; three Sharpies: ultrafine, fine, and chisel-tip (recommended to wait until class begins).
HS Art III	<i>Possible</i> fee for bronze castings, depending on size/ weight (approximately \$10-30).
Honors Anatomy & Physiology	Two-pocket folder with brads to be used only for Honors Anatomy & Physiology; four white board markers, in different colors.
Latin: ALL classes	"Cassell's Latin-English Dictionary," ISBN 978-0-02-013340-7 - or - "The New College Latin and English Dictionary," ISBN 978-0-553-59012-8. Note: If your current Latin binder is no longer sturdy and rings do not stay securely closed, please purchase a replacement.
Life Science 6 & 7	Note: <i>Possible</i> field trip to the Cheyenne Mountain Zoo (approximately \$10).
Medieval History/Bible/Literature	Only if new to ECA: Tab dividers, 5-pack.
Modern History/Literature 9	Spiral (no Meade-type) notebook, college-ruled.
Physical Education	P.E. t-shirts are sized, ordered, and billed to ECA accounts the first week of classes; HS only: Three-ring binder, 1/2".
Rhetoric	One <u>red</u> , two-pocket folder (for negative casework) and matching highlighter; one <u>blue</u> , two-pocket folder (for affirmative casework) and matching highlighter; Note: For each Debate Tournament (November and April) - a food item or \$5 for the Judges' Luncheon.
Senior Seminar	"Surviving Religion 101" by Michael Kruger, ISBN 978-1433572074 (for 2nd Semester).
Spanish I & II	White board marker; the Meade-type composition book used in Spanish I, or new. Note: A <i>possible</i> field trip to the Elementary campus and lunch (approximately \$20).
Spanish III	White board marker; the Meade-type composition book used in Spanish I and/or II, or new. Note: A <i>possible</i> mission trip to Ecuador during Spring Break.
World Literature	Post-it Tabs: 1", writable, removable; "Silas Marner," <i>purchase from Mrs. Butler</i> (\$5).
Yearbook	Access to a camera (phone camera is acceptable).
